CONSTITUTIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Article **10.1** – **10.5** of the **MSU Constitution** sets out the constitutional responsibilities of the MSU Social Sciences Faculty Convenor. I have outlined my constitutional responsibilities below and have commented on my progress in fulfilling them.

List of Constitutional Responsibility:

1. The Faculty Convenors shall be the primary means of communications between the students and student academic representative in their Faculty and the Executive. In particular the Faculty Convenors shall be responsible for raising awareness of issues specific to their respective faculties in all appropriate for a including the Student Senate and Executive Meetings.

Academic Representatives have been elected. I have assisted with multiple Academic Issues including but not limited to:

- Assignment overload
- Lack of clarity with assignment briefings
- Issues with the delivery of class content

I have emailed lecturers on behalf of students and assisted academic reps with curating emails for them to send to lecturers.

I continue to be a support for my reps and students in the faculty if any issues arise.

In relation to feedback, I've had lecturers respond well to feedback provided by both myself and reps, and have taken the feedback into account. This has helped lessen the stress that the students are facing in their modules.

2. They shall be responsible for the recruitment of Student Academic Representatives within their own faculty.

I have **worked alongsid**e the VP Education, Alex Balfe and the Academic Representation Administrator, Seán Masterson, to discuss different ways to **recruit** Academic Representatives.

I have met with the VP Education and Academic Representation Administrator multiple times to **discuss the progress** of Academic Representative Recruitment.

- I have **compiled** a list of **lectures** from my Faculty and my own classes.
- Each day I would analyse the Academic Representative Call of Business report to focus on the key courses that may not have a representative going forward.
- 3. Each Faculty Convenor shall arrange for a Faculty Assembly meeting to occur in their respective faculties normally six times per academic year, normally with three meetings per semester.

The first meeting of Social Sciences Faculty Assembly took place **on October 21**st during Academic Rep Training.

4. The Faculty Convenor shall be the Chairperson of their respective Faculty Assemblies.

I chaired the first meeting of Social Sciences Faculty Assembly on October 21st.

5. A Deputy Chairperson and Secretary shall be elected from the Faculty Assembly at the first meeting for the year.

I have elected a Deputy Chairperson and Secretary at the first meeting of the Social Sciences Faculty Assembly.

The Deputy Chairperson is **Aoife Hynes** and the Secretary is **Sarah Lindsay Swan.**

6. They shall, where practicable, undergo training during the summer months as organised by the Union.

I have **participated** in Executive Crossover and Officer Training in June.

MANIFESTO INITIATIVES

While running for Social Sciences Faculty Convenor, I outlined several manifesto pledges. Throughout my term I will make progress on each of these promises to the best of my ability.

a) Promote **activism** within the Social Sciences Faculty Assembly by having a segment dedicated to Academic Reps to bring any issues or campaigns related to activism.

- I have **promoted** the **#WheresMyLevy** campaign through my Social Sciences **email** and through the **group chat**.

Informal team bonding sessions for Academic Representatives such as tea/coffee mornings.

- I will be working with the **VP Education** and the **Faculty Convenors** with organising this.
- I have spoken to the Academic Representation Administrator about the feasibility of holding a coffee morning for Academic Reps.
- I plan to utilise this for a future meeting of the Social Sciences Faculty Assembly.

Equality (Accessibility & Diversity)

Ensure that all documentation is accessible for students and Academic Reps.

- This manifesto point is line with the regulations of the 'Accessible
 Documentation' Mandate.
- I will ensure that all my officer reports and documentation that is distributed to Senators and to Academic Representatives are following those guidelines.

Continue to have a blended option for student who are not on campus.

- Due to the Faculty Assembly meeting during Academic Rep Training being
 in-person, I could not facilitate a blended option for this meeting.
- However, going forward for future meetings, I will be facilitating a
 blended option for my reps.

Work with the VP Welfare & Equality to create a working group/forum/advisory panel to promote diversity in leadership roles.

- This is currently in the planning process. I will be working alongside the
 VP Welfare and Equality on the creation of the Diversity Panel.
- I have been working alongside the LGBT+ Senator, Ben Holmes, on a potential plan for the panel.

Empower

Encourage the Academic Representatives in the Social Sciences Faculty to go for other roles / positions if they are thinking of running for them.

 I encouraged reps to go for roles within the Social Sciences Faculty such as the various committees and roles.

- However, there are currently two vacant seats on the Student Charter
 Committee within the Social Sciences Faculty.
- I will be encouraging reps to go for the committee at the next Faculty
 Assembly.

Ensure that the Academic Representatives elected as members of the Student Senate are made known to fellow representatives.

- During the first meeting of the Social Sciences Faculty Assembly, members of the faculty elected their Faculty Senators.
- The Academic Representatives that were elected onto the Student Senate are: Aoife Hynes, Elizabeth Mccolgan, and Michelle Gorman.
- The Academic Representatives that currently sit on the Student Senate are: Conor Cronin (Independent Senator), Michael Comer (Community Senator), Vivek Allampally (Charity Senator).
- I have circulated a **document** via **email** to the Academic Reps **highlighting** the **list** of the **Reps elected** at the meeting.

Encourage members that sit on the MSU Student Senate to take part in the 'Senate Updates' section of the Social Sciences Faculty Assembly meetings.

- At the **first** meeting of the **Social Sciences Faculty Assembly**, we elected the **three academic** reps that would sit on the Student Senate.
- The list of Academic Reps that sit on the Student Senate in the paragraph above.
- As the first sitting of the Student Senate has not met, there was no Senate
 Update required.

Once the first sitting of the Student Senate has taken place on November
 9th, I will be encouraging Academic Reps that sit on Senate to provide the
 'Senate Update'

- The Academic Representative Recruitment campaign began on Tuesday,
 September 20th to Monday, October 3rd. Throughout this period, I was actively recruiting Academic Reps.
- I **promoted** Academic Rep **Recruitment** on my **personal Instagram** stories over the **two weeks** of the recruitment campaign.
- I assisted with the Academic Representative Recruitment table under the tent outside the John Hume building and occasionally at the MSU Stand during Clubs and Societies Fairs Day.
- We had incentives for students to become an Academic Rep such as a free
 can of Red Bull and a pack of Trebor Mints if they successfully nominated
 themselves as an Academic Representatives.

- During my shifts at the AR Recruitment table, I talked to many students
 who were interested in becoming a representative, many of which were
 studying a subject within the Social Sciences Faculty.
- I had a **QR code** on the back of my **phone case** linked to the Academic Representative **Nomination Form** as an easy way to **encourage** prospective representatives to **sign up**.
- I met most of my Academic Reps during the Training Sessions on October
 21st and 22nd. `
- I will be working alongside the VP Education and the Academic Representation Administrator with filling the vacant seats in the Social Sciences Faculty.

MSU Executive

The governing body of the Union is the Student Senate. The three core functions of the Senate are to formulate Union policy, mandate members of the Executive, and hold the Executive accountable.

- However, the first sitting has been postponed to November 9th due to unforeseen circumstances.

MSU Social Sciences Faculty Assembly

The Social Sciences Faculty Assembly provides a forum for discussions on all issues relevant to the education, welfare, and student experience for students in the Social Sciences Faculty.

- The Social Sciences Faculty Assembly met on Friday, October 21st.
- I have circulated a **doodle** poll for **Academic Reps** to fill for the next meeting which will be held after the first meeting of the Student Senate.

MSU Academic Assembly

The Student Academic Assembly provides a forum for all academic representatives to provide feedback and advice on academic-related issues to the VP Education and the Faculty Convenors.

MSU Academic Representation Review Committee

The Academic Representation Review Committee advises the VP Education on the effectiveness and development needs of student academic representation.
